Johnson Park Apartments (JPA) Housing Living Services Program is authorized by the New York State Office of Alcoholism & Substance Abuse Services (OASAS) pursuant to the New York State Mental Hygiene Law to operate a Part 819 chemical dependence supportive housing living services in the Upstate New York. The program is for mothers with special needs who desire to maintain physical custody of their children.

JPA will have on Site OASAS Certified Residential Clinical Staff to provide services to the family, so mothers can focus on successfully completing treatment programs in a supportive, structured and safe environment that is free from survival-related anxiety. Mothers working with JPA OASAS Staff in coordination with Mental Health Case Management will develop a Service Intervention Plan with a strategy and timeline designed to meet their goals, build hope, and develop confidence so that they can live independently with their children, become a more effective parent, pursue sobriety, an education, go to job training and choose a career that can lead to becoming self-sufficient.

The JPA OASAS Supportive Housing Living Services Program is conveniently located in the City of Utica in a recently remodeled home. Each Family has its own apartment in a beautiful and clean community. A Handicap accessible apartment is available, too.

Eligibility

Persons accepted into the JPA OASAS Supportive Housing Living Program must meet the following requirements:

- Homeless mother or mother with a significant risk of homelessness.
- Women 18 years of age and older.
- Confirmed parent/custodian with physical custody of child(ren) under 18 years of age.
- Have a diagnosis of substance abuse and mental health disabilities.
- Willing participate in Supportive Services.
- Meet TANF low income eligibility requirements.
